

Application Notes

Spirolaxine is the major metabolite isolated from the white wood rot fungus, Sporotrichum laxum, reported by Arnone and coworkers in 1990. The absolute stereochemistry of spirolaxine was solved by researchers at CNR-ICRM, Italy in 2005. Spirolaxine follows a common biosynthetic route to phanerosporic acid but undergoes a series of hydroxylation, cyclisation and methylation steps. Spirolaxine is a potent antibacterial, specifically against Helicobacter pylori.
